State Energy Sector Partnership Program Pre-Application



To be eligible for training you must be 18 years of age or over, and; **1)** have a social security number; **2)** have the right to work in the U.S.; **3)** comply with Selective Service registration requirements (for males); **4)** Meet SESP eligibility requirements.

Participant Information (please provide all information)

In order to qualify for training, certain demographics as specified by USDOL must be met. To determine program eligibility you must check all that apply. Be prepared to provide supporting documentation as needed.

- a veteran or qualified spouse of a veteran
- meet low-income eligibility guidelines (see below)
- disabled
- currently unemployed
- an incumbent (currently employed) worker in need of skills upgrades for a solar, wind, biofuels, green building/energy efficiency green job.
- a dislocated worker; those who have been terminated, laid off, received notice of termination or self-employed, but is now unemployed
- in need of updated training related to energy efficiency and renewable energy; those who have been terminated, laid off, received notice of termination or were self-employed, but are now unemployed and can benefit from training to enter or advance in these industries
- worker impacted by national energy and environmental policy
- high school dropout
- limited English proficient
- criminal ex-offender, including juvenile
- a woman

Completing this pre-application **does not** ensure that you will receive training through the SESP Program. You must return this completed pre-application to your nearest Workforce Connection Center to complete the application process and determine if you are eligible for training.
