



## Definitions

OC- On Campus; NC- Non Campus; PP- Public Property

A hate or bias related crime is the commission of a criminal offense which was motivated by the offender's bias. If the facts of the case indicate that the offender was motivated to commit the offense because of his/her bias against the victim's race, gender, religion, sexual orientation, ethnicity, or disability, the offense is then classified as a hate/bias crime, also included with the above categories will be larceny in any degree.

SaVe: Campus Sexual Violence Elimination Act (March 2013)

The Campus SaVe Act was signed into law in March 2013 and has four requirements:

Identify the institution's Campus Security Authority Personnel.

Create a Campus Sexual Assault Victim Bill of Rights.

Expand sexual crime reporting on campus.

Ensure the College has standard operating procedures for handling incidents of sexual violence.

The Campus SaVe Act falls under section 304 of the Violence Against Women Act (VAWA).

It covers students, faculty and staff of the institution.

The Act requires the public posting of an annual campus security report, including:

- Statement of Campus Policy

- Campus Crime Statistics

- Campus Sexual Assault Victim Bill of Rights

- SaVe Act Statistics
