- Ms. Mary Beth Busch, Sr. Executive Director of Workforce Development
  - Went to Mountain States Association of Community Colleges Conference representing nine different States and eighteen presidents, presented the Workforce Development designed to support our students.
  - Making sure that access is available from multiple points, credit & non-credit
- Dr. Manny Encinias, Professor and Discipline Chair Agricultural, Animal, and Farrier Sciences
  - ➤ We are working and collaborating with other Institutions, Academic Affairs and Workforce Development on the Meat Processing Academy. There is a lot of interest in New Mexico since we are a meat producing State. We have the curriculum developed to help enhance skill sets, strengthen job opportunities, and provide opportunities to the workforce. This program is ready to be launched this Fall on the workforce development and academic side. In June we completed our first round of classes with Wisconsin students completed the program. August we will conduct a needs assessment to benefit facilities. We have begun a needs assessment with the Evans family.
  - ➤ August 9<sup>th</sup> Hosting a meeting with the Rocky Mountain Farmers Union

- ➤ October We will be the Flag Ship Institution in New Mexico to host the Western Meat Schools with five other States attending
- ➤ There are a lot of opportunities to take advantage of USDA Grants
- ➤ Mobile unit for the Meat Processing, we are looking for funding opportunities
- ➤ CDL program launched March 20, 2022, with a great trainer, Mr. Alejandro Ojeda. One of the issues was to be able to host the examination for the CDL here in Tucumcari instead of the students needing to travel to take the test. It looks like we will be able to host the State examination for the CDL class "A" certification.
- Working on improving access to the students
- ➤ The Federal Government is offering multimillion dollar grants for meat production. The criterion for receiving this grant is the College needs to be a Rural Serving Institution, serving Hispanic and Tribal populations, and in an area that has a high meat production service.
